Granger Update

Granger representatives visited with our Board to discuss current happenings occurring at their facility. As part of ongoing construction, over the past few months Granger has been expanding their landfill gas collection system. This process consists of drilling, excavating and connecting gas system components to more efficiently collect landfill gas. During this process, there is a greater chance of odors, and Granger representatives have acknowledged and apologized for the recent strong odors. Granger assured us that this is temporary, until this phase of construction is complete. Granger normally completes this process during the fall, but a wet fall followed by an unseasonably warm winter has created unstable conditions presenting delays and safety concerns. As this process continues, you may notice fluctuations of odors as crews work to get vacuum to the new system components. In the meantime, Granger is committed to deploying various odor mitigation measures and will continue to do so throughout this process.

Would you like to be part of the Granger Neighborhood Network? As part of this network you will receive an email when construction, compost grinding or other activity outside of normal operations will be occurring and may cause odor.
